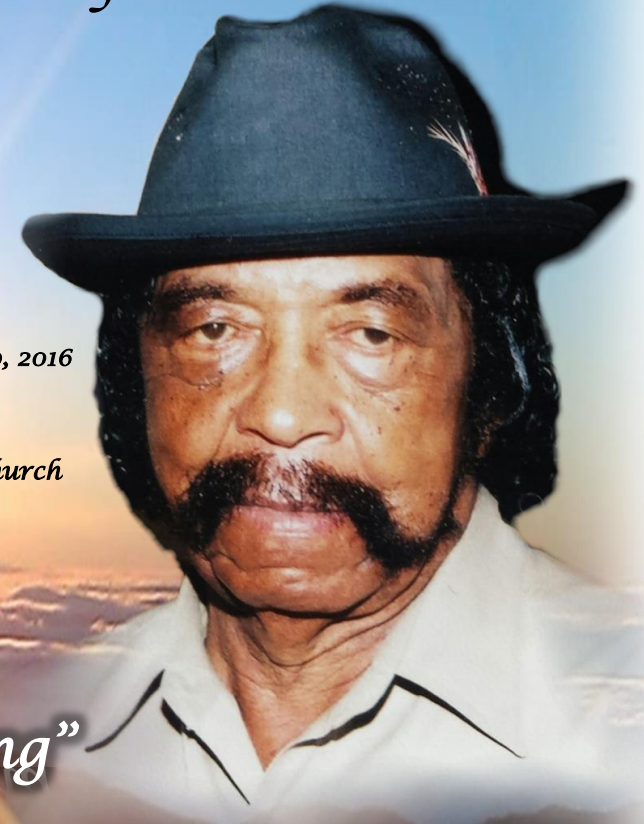

## Reflections Of Life
